

Jacob Cohen - Founder of C.K.O.Y. -burial  
 "Cheva Kedusha Ohel Yitzchak" Society  
 At gate 7 in Bayside there was a wrought  
 iron gate with the Cheva's name. My cousin  
 found it had fallen off & I asked for them to  
 save it & re-attach it. It was then discarded.  
 This is a piece of N.Y. Jewish history, the  
 first Orthodox burial society in N.Y. In the  
 eighties, the burial duties were given over to  
 Riverside in Manhattan.

All of these people are buried in Bayside, as well as Jacob & Rachel (P.I) except for Fanny & Low Simon who ceded their plots to my husband & myself, which 2 plots are right in front of my parents', William & Blanche

All of these people died in N.Y.

There is a Jones branch of the family who came from Chicago.

The Moss, Rothman & Levy families are at Bayside,

Most of the graves of this large extended family are inaccessible.

Jacob Cohen, my great-grandfather, who went to California for the gold rush, ran for comptroller of NYC, & was offered the job of medical examiner of NY (declined because he was a "Kohen") seemed to be quite a "personage" in N.Y. real estate. He is mentioned in the book "Jewish Landmarks of New York" by Postal.

The Cohen men were presidents of their synagogues, etc. & active in Jewish philanthropic life.

I'm sorry I just don't have dates of death for all these people, but of course they would be on the headstones
